GALLERY: Crews demolish longtime landmark in downtown St. George

ST. GEORGE, Utah (KUTV) — A longtime landmark in St. George was demolished Friday morning.

Locals came to the spot where the historic Flood Street chapel stood for nearly 70 years.

Construction crews left a pallet of bricks for locals to take home to remember the historic church.

The pallet was set out at 9:00 a.m. Friday and were long gone before 10:30 a.m.

"The early bird gets the worm...so...(laughs)...I was late," resident Eric Whitney said. "But really what's inside is where it's at so we just have some treasured memories here."

Locals said they wanted to use the bricks for doorstops, bookends, and garden décor.

The city of St. George bought the building and the property for \$1.1 million.

According to city leaders, a new fire station will be built on the land.
