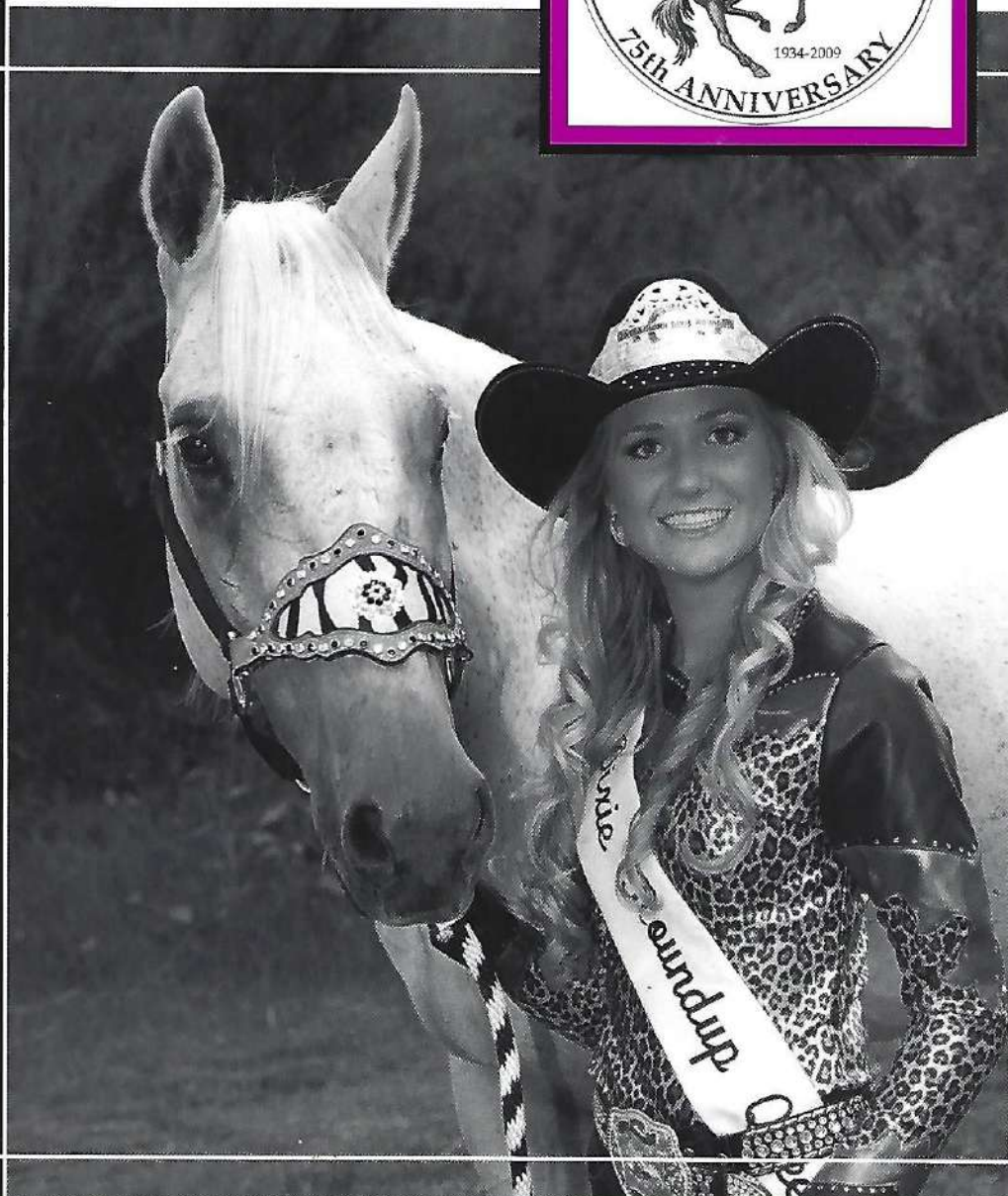


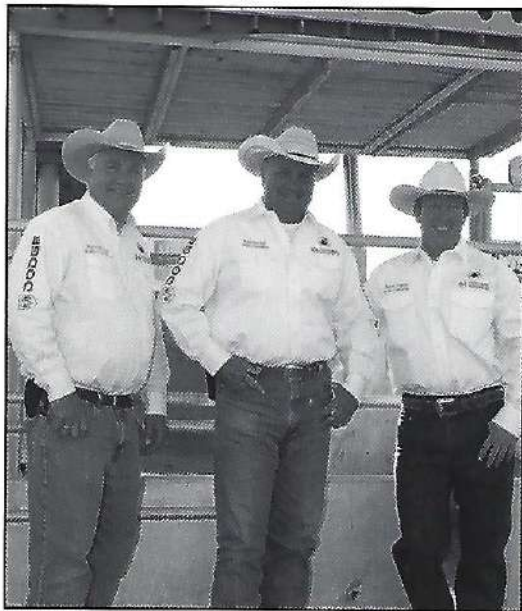

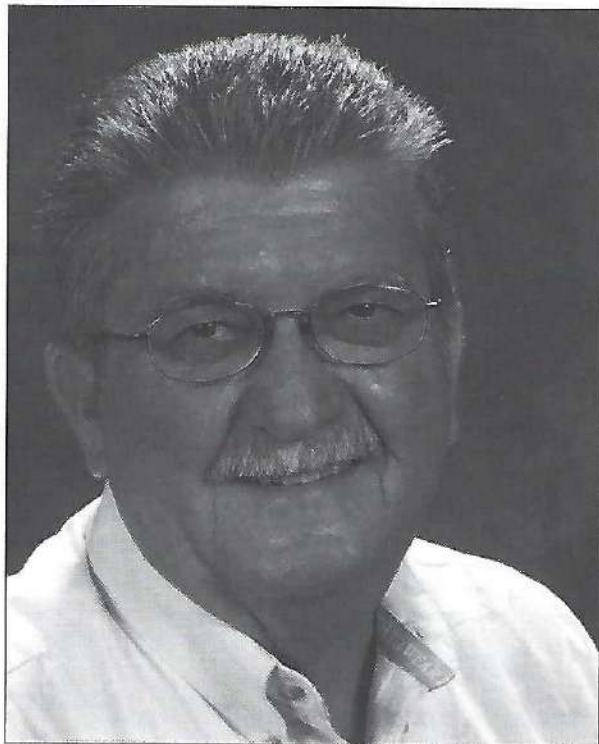

WILLIAM "BILL" BOYES

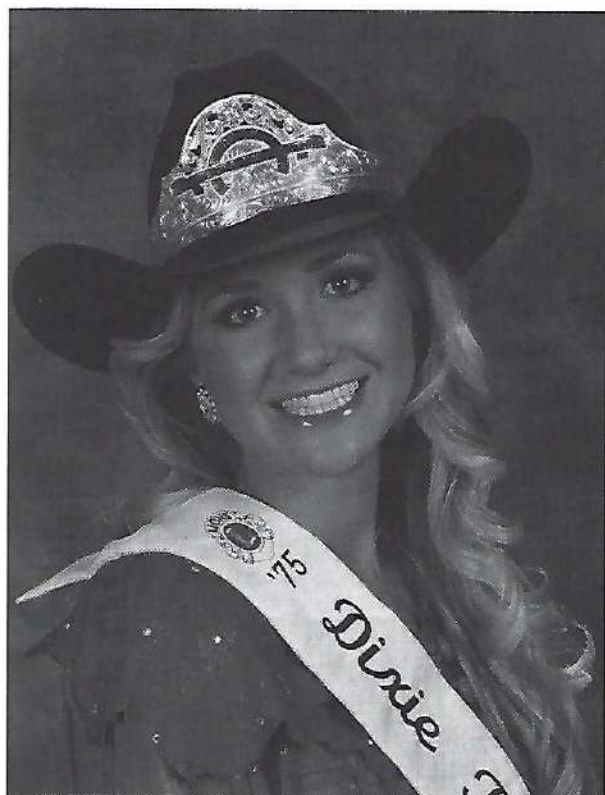

Summer is a graduate of Pine View High School and a sophomore at Dixie State College. She is pursuing an Associate of Science Degree and education endorsement as she aspires to

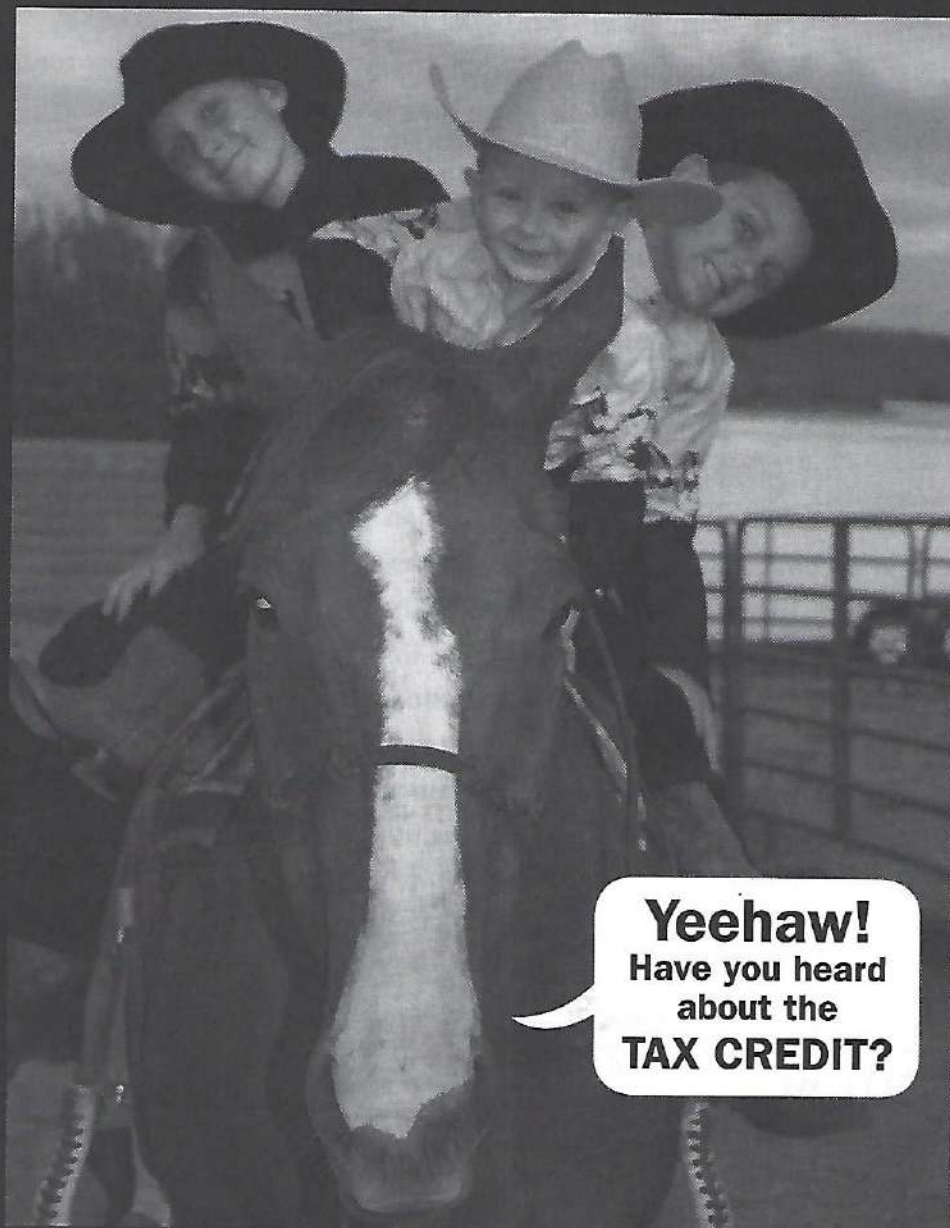
follow in the footsteps of her mother and become an elementary school teacher.

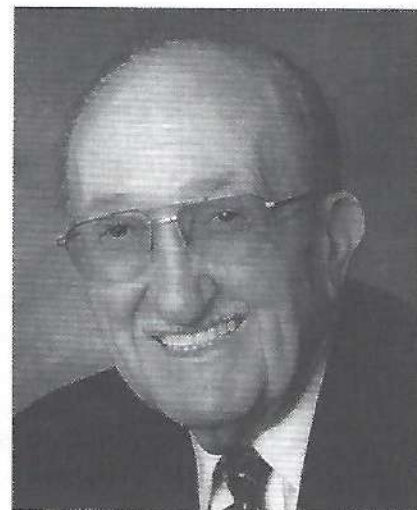

BILL BRINGHURST



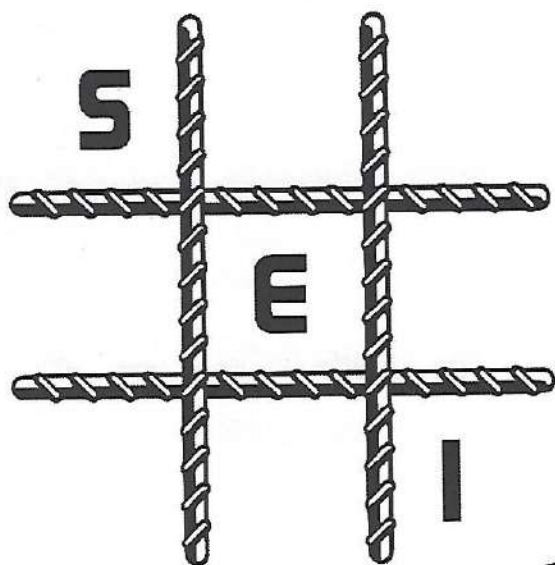

ONE THING YOU CAN ALWAYS COUNT ON

The Lion's Dixie Roundup Celebrates its 75th Year

In a world that changes by the minute there are few things you can count on. Yet one thing southern Utahns have counted on every fall for the last 75 years is the Lion's Dixie Roundup. There has always been something mythic about this annual spectacle. For three or four generations it is something that has always been, and something we naturally assume will always be; something so constant it is easy to forget it does not just happen. All year long there are people behind the scenes seeing to it that the tradition continues. They're members of the St. George Lions Club, a group of service-minded volunteers who enjoy getting together every Thursday night and who, in turn, give countless hours of time and labor to make such an event a reality.

For many of us who grew up in southern Utah, the Roundup is a rite of fall as cherished and natural as Thanksgiving. We may not have realized that the rodeo, which has been held every fall since 1934, raised money

for people in need while it provided an opportunity for the cowboys of our area to test their skills against the best in the land. And we never stopped to think that what happened every September at the Sun

Bowl was a profoundly important thread in the fabric of our community's culture. All we knew was that it was Rodeo time, the grand and glorious affair we could always count on just a couple of long weeks after the hard medicine of going back to school.

Rome has its Coliseum, Boston its Fenway Park. And we have our Lions Dixie Sun Bowl. Perfectly situated in the center of town it is an island of memory amidst a sea of changing times, and arena of spectacle and flesh-and-blood reality in a world gone virtual. It is the place where generations of southern Utahns



have convened to experience larger than life events that add a mythic dimension to the everyday. Since it was completed just after World War II by a corps of community volunteers with privately donated money and materials, the Sun Bowl has stood as a symbol of community pride and a tangible example of the difficult to

define Dixie Spirit. It was built as the home of the Dixie Roundup Rodeo, but it was also the home field for Dixie High School and Dixie College football for several decades. Over the years it hosted softball tournaments, dance festivals, music concerts, Fourth of July celebrations, Easter egg hunts, and countless other events emblazoned on the memories of thousands of southern Utahns. But more than anything it was the rodeo grounds, the place where every September the community gathered on three nights to revel in the pageantry of western life and tried to hold onto something that seemed to be slowly slipping through their fingers.

A lot of things have slipped through our fingers in recent years as the town has changed immeasurably. But one thing has not changed. Relic that it is, the Dixie Sun Bowl still stands in the city's center, and on three nights in the middle of September you can still hear the

roar of the crowd lift through the towering stadium lights into the perfect autumn darkness over St. George. Those erstwhile members of the Lions Club still meet every Thursday night to plan and prepare and make it happen. And the best rodeo cowboys in the world show up in St. George every year to give the locals a run for their money and provide a real-life thrill for the thousands who crowd into the Sun Bowl and sit on its hard concrete seats.

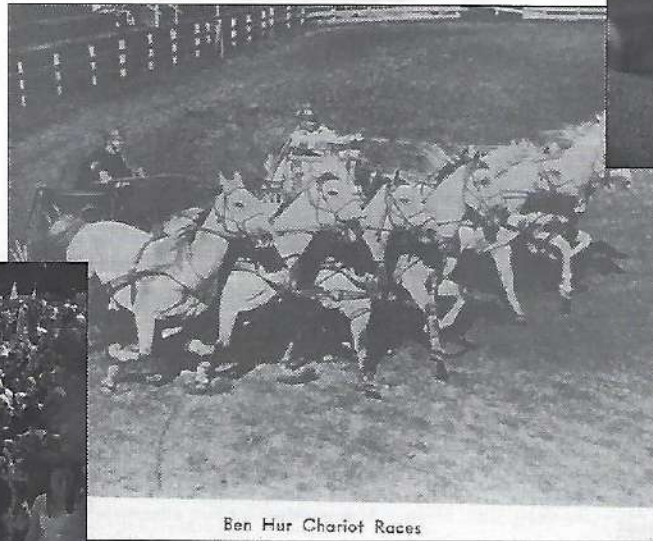
It's a story that has repeated itself every



fall for three-quarters of a century, a story full of community pride and the kind of authentic entertainment no digital application can offer. Every year you know the grinding summer sun will finally wane, the Dixie air will start to carry in it a hint of winter's coming, the stock trucks will arrive on the north side of the Sun Bowl, and suddenly a new generation of kids will gather from every part of town. And there they stand, fingers laced in the chain link fence, eyes widened with wonder as the great and terrible bulls rumble down the ramp and find their




places in the pen and paw the dirt with their huge hooves and indifferently twitch their wide flat backs and wait with the kind of patience no kid can know for the rodeo to begin and the gate to open and the story to start all over again.

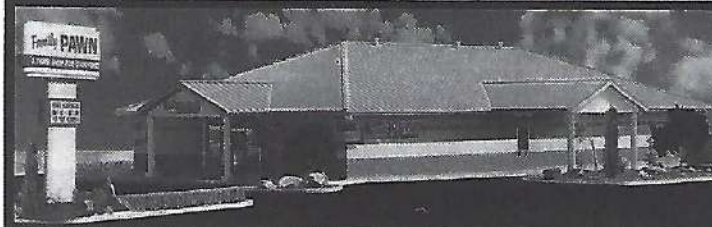

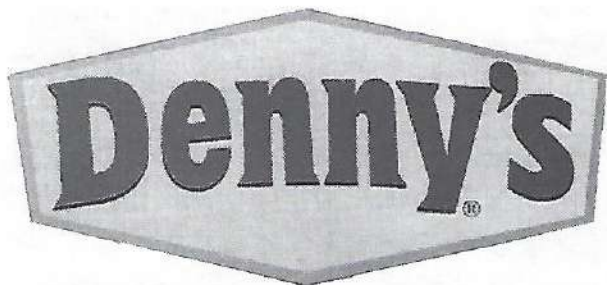

Board; with professional landscaping planning being done under direction of Karsten Hansen.

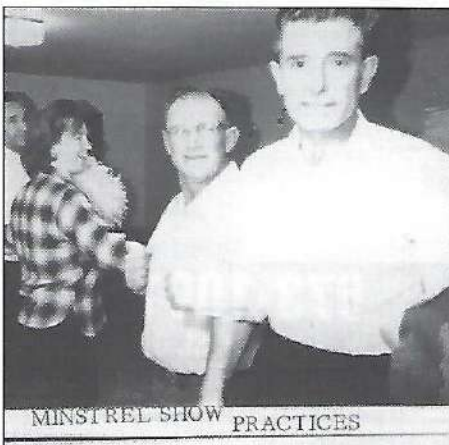
According to President Arthur Bruhn of Dixie College the first steps in the program will include installation of a sprinkler system and planting grass and trees.

The St. George Lions Club, the Washington County Road Department and the City of St. George Road Department are cooperating


in the work being done to repair and improve the skyline drive just to the north of the city.

A good many years ago the local Lions Club built the first road across the Sugar Loaf skyline to provide a view of the city from a good vantage point.





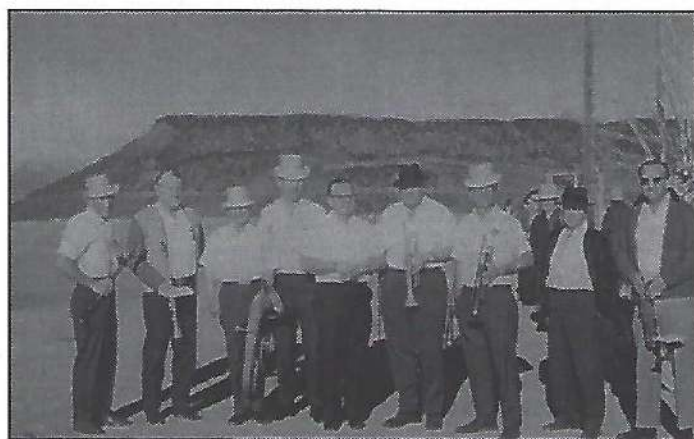

CONSTRUCTION OF THE DIXIE SUN BOWL

During the late 1930's and early 1940's, a few of the Lions of the St. George Lions Club conceived and planned the construction of a multi-purpose sports arena. Foremost in their plans was a rodeo arena of sufficient size and facility to accommodate the annual Lions Roundup and Rodeo which had been initiated and sponsored by the St. George Lions Club since 1935. They felt a college football field and multi-purpose arena could be encompassed in these general plans; one that could accommodate dance festivals, soft ball, graduation exercises for college and high school, summer recreation programs and any other events where large space, adequate seating (five to six thousand persons), and lighting are required.

With this in mind, the Club selected a general committee, and target date for completion of the basic facility was set for the annual Roundup to be held in September, 1947. The committee included Neal Lundberg, Dr. L.W. McGregor as finance chairman, and Les Holcomb as engineer and construction superintendent. The balance of the Club, as well as many innocent bystanders, were pressed into action and the Sun Bowl was on its way.

Construction was started in 1946 and the initial phase of the project was completed in time for the Dixie Roundup in 1947. Initial construction began with the shaping of the bowl with entrances at both east and west ends. Seats were formed and built with



cinder block risers and cement was applied with a new gunite process. Fences and corrals were built, along with chutes and catch pens for rodeo stock. An announcer's stand was built over the chutes. The Dixie College and High School boys were called in to clear and level the arena as well as help clean off the seats and the first show was ready to roll. Concession stands, restrooms, ticket booths, entrances, fences, retaining walls, chutes, lights, horse stalls, ramps and miscellaneous other improvements have been added throughout the years.

The initial fund goal was set by the Lions Club at \$30,000. The Club had saved a building fund from previous activities of over \$10,000 and in addition pledged each member to a cash contribution of \$100.00. Only two members failed to live up to this pledge. With over half of their fund goal already at

hand, the Lions then went to the citizens of the area to ask that they match this amount to build the project. By March 16, 1948 total contributions amounted to \$35,574.82. Proceeds from rodeos and other activities since went back into the Bowl, making possible the additions mentioned.

With the completion of the restroom facilities on the north side of the arena in the fall of 1960, the project was officially finished. Time and space make it impossible to name all those who helped make this project a reality, but each can have the satisfaction of knowing that he was a part of a wonderful project which has enriched the lives of all those in this community for generations.

ST. GEORGE LIONS CLUB BUILDING STADIUM-ARENA WITH SEATING CAPACITY OF OVER FIVE THOUSAND

The Lions Club has recently undertaken an important project -- that of erecting a large stadium as an entertainment center in St. George. This stadium will have a seating capacity of 5,500. The arena proper will be a sodded field for sports: rodeos, livestock shows, softball, football, volleyball, track meets and various other athletic games. It will also serve as a setting for musical entertainments, such as band concerts, oratorios, pageants, etc.

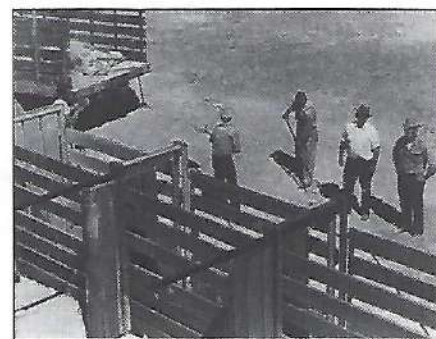
The Washington County school and all civic organizations of St. George are backing this project 100 percent. To date the Lions Club has \$15,000 on hand which has accumulated over a period of years along with a generous membership contribution, to carry forward the work on this stadium. They are asking the civic-minded citizens of St. George to match this amount. Upon completion of the stadium its sponsors will turn it over to the City of St. George. The Lions sincerely feel that they have undertaken a big, but worthwhile, project, which will not only be a monument to our city, but an entertainment center for its citizens, to enjoy for many years to come.

The captains and their crews of Lions club members will be starting out soon on their all-out effort to collect the needed funds for the completion of the stadium. To stimulate contributions in this drive, a 1947 Plymouth car will be given away. Inquire of the Lion who contacts you for a contribution the particulars of this gift.

As St. George citizens, both young and old, will benefit greatly from this stadium, let's get behind the Lions and push their drive to a speedy completion!

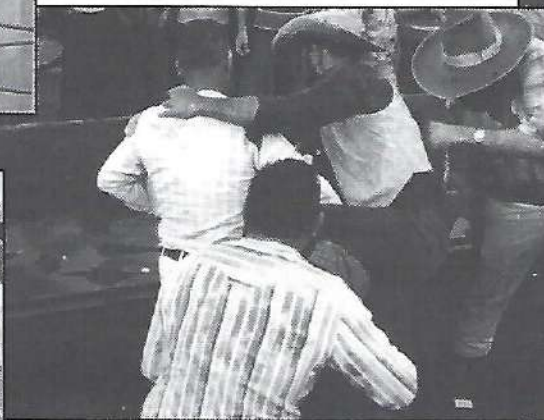
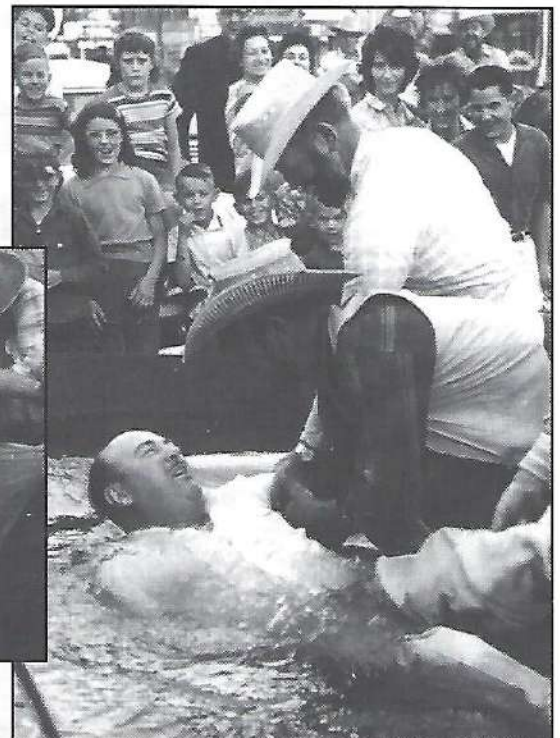


The St. George Lions Club Kangaroo Court

The purpose of the Kangaroo Court was to furnish entertainment for the public, advertising the City and merchants and furnishing financial aid to the Annual Dixie Roundup. The goal was to catch all people who weren't in western attire and punish those men who hadn't grown beards or purchased a rodeo button shaving permit from Fenton's, McMullins, Firestone, or Nelson Supply. All who had not grown beards were advised to make a feeble attempt immediately. The Kangaroo Court followed the old western custom of giving everyone a fair trial and then hanging them! Rules and Regulations were:

1. Beards were optional but any person raising a little facial shrubbery (women included) would receive due consideration from the court.
2. Everyone had to wear western apparel. Merchants were required to have all employees in extra loud garb.
3. All fines would be left up to the judgment of the court as to the amount and when and where payable.
4. Above, all, everyone had to show proper Rodeo Spirit or suffer the condemnation of the Court.

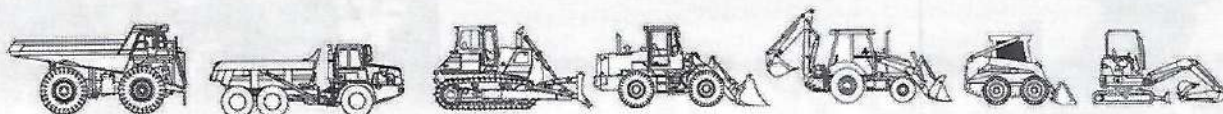

THE KERBY LEGACY

Bar T Down Rodeos began in 1945 When D. A. "Swanny" Kerby supplied the Moab Rodeo with stock "because there was no one else in that kind of business." Because bucking stock was scarce in the Four Corners area, he rounded up wild mustangs and shipped in the first Brahma bulls to the Canyonlands area. Score Your Own

(reprinted from the 1978 Roundup Magazine)

There's more to rodeo than just watching cowboys "hit the dirt."

Since these riders are competing against one another for sizable purses, the judging of their rides is critical.

What follows is a brief outline of the points a judge looks for when scoring the stock and contestants in the 'rough stock event' (bareback, saddle bronc and bull riding). On the opposite page is a score sheet where you may, if you are not too distracted by all the spectacle going on, grade the animals and the riders as well as possible champions.

BAREBACK RIDING

As in all riding events, both the horse and rider are marked separately on a scale of 1 - 25. The sum of these two scores is the cowboy's grade for the event. A disqualification is zero.

JUDGING THE HORSE

- 1) How high does he kick?
- 2) How hard does he jump?
- 3) How difficult is he to ride?
- 4) In how many different directions does he go?

Remember that the best grades are given for the 'rankest' (that is, the nastiest and most spirited) animal. This a horse that turns back on itself, spins, snaps, bucks the full time and does not travel far from the chute earns a higher score and the docile or running animal scores lower.

JUDGING THE RIDER

- 1) How well does the man spur?
- 2) How good is his control of the animal?
- 3) Is he in balance or is he constantly fighting to stay on?

The rider's score depends largely on his spurring. So important is this that the man's spurs must be touching the horse above the break of the neck on the first jump out of the chute. Failure to do this results in a disqualification.

Remember, also, that a man's spurring must be high and long-stroked in rhythm with the horse's movements. Should a man stop or lose control, points are deducted accordingly.

DISQUALIFICATIONS:

- 1) Failure to spur on the first jump out of the chute
- 2) Touching the horse or equipment with rider's free hand.
- 3) Falling off before the eight second buzzer.

SADDLE BRONC RIDING:

Judging the saddle bronc riding event is essentially the same as judging bareback bronc riding. For the animal, the emphasis is on how rank he is, how wildly he performs and how difficult he is to ride.

For the man, the emphasis is again on how well he spurs, how certain his control and how sure his ride.

DISQUALIFICATIONS:

- 1) Failing to spur on the first jump out of the chute.
- 2) Touching the horse or equipment with a free hand.
- 3) Losing the rein or changing hands on the rein.
- 4) Losing a stirrup
- 5) Falling off before the eight second buzzer.

BULLRIDING

Bulls, as every cowboy will tell you, are about the nastiest animals on earth. Despite this and the clearly present danger of falling off below those heavy hooves or being impaled on wicked horns, the riders still do more than simply attempt to hang on for the required eight seconds.

JUDGING THE BULL:

- 1) How high does the bull kick?
- 2) How high does he jump?
- 3) How difficult is he to ride?
- 4) In how many different directions does he go with what speed and snap?

JUDGING THE RIDER:

- 1) Control is the key. Does the man assume command of the bull?
- 2) Does he stay reasonably erect or does he flop from side to side?
- 3) Although spurring is not required in bull riding, check to see how well placed the man's legs are. Do they dangle and flop or do they seem to help him in his ride? Again, the form and control are the keys.

RERIDES:

Occasionally, through no fault of the rider, the animal or the failure of a piece of equipment will foul the rider and allow the man another chance. This may occur when:

- 1) The animal become fouled in or out of the chute.
- 2) The animal stops and refuses to move.
- 3) The animal fails to buck or runs without bucking.
- 4) The animal falls.
- 5) The flank strap falls off.
- 6) The horse is hit by a pick-up man before the end of the elapsed riding time.
