

Joe started working for the St. George Fire Department with his dad and formally became a fireman in 1961 when he became legal age. He served as Fire Chief for six years and retired after 50 years of volunteer service. Joe grew up working with his father, Clark, in the electrical trade until he accepted a position with the City of St George as a building inspector. He became influential in the Utah Building Inspectors Association and was awarded the Jesse Miller Award for Excellence for his work. He retired from the City of St. George as Chief Building Official in 2002. In 1959, Joe joined the Utah National Guard, subsequently the Army National Guard. He was awarded the Minute Man Award and several other National Guard ribbons for his work in the guard. He was honorably discharged as a Lieutenant Colonel in 1983. He was instrumental in organizing the Jr. Chamber of Commerce and has been a proud member of the Dixie Elks Organization for over 50 years. Joe joined the



Dixie Lions Club in 1968 and served as Lions President 1975-1976. He was awarded a lifetime Dixie Lions Club membership in 2019 for his service. 
Kodie Stowell



and unique act. Since then he has performed in hundreds of venues including rodeos and equine events.





Talkin' like a Rodeo Cowboy

BARRELMAN: an entertainer who uses a barrel to distract a bull after a ride, sometimes to protect the cowboy.

BOX: in a timed event, the area a horse and rider back into before they make a roping run.

BREAKING THE BARRIER: in a timed event, if the rider leaves the box too soon – failing to give the animal enough of a head start – he is assessed a 10-second penalty.

BULLDOGGER: a steer wrestler

BULLFIGHTER: two athletes who protect the bull rider after he dismounts by distracting the bull and directing its attention to the exit gate, sometimes stepping between the bull and the bull rider.

COVERING: staying on for at least the minimum time, eight seconds; "He covered all three broncs he rode last weekend."

CROSSFIRE PENALTY: in team roping, if the header doesn't change the direction of the steer before the heeler catches, the run is disqualified.

FLANK STRAP: a soft sheepskin- or neoprene-lined strap placed in the area where a human's belt would go, it encourages the animal to kick out behind itself rather than rear up, which provides a safer, showier ride.

HAZER: in steer wrestling, the cowboy who rides on the other side of the steer from the contestant to make sure the steer runs straight.

HEADER/HEELER: the two partners in team roping – the header throws the first rope over the animal's head or horns, and the heeler throws the second rope to catch the steer's hind legs.

HOOEY: the knot that a cowboy uses to finish tying the calf's legs together in tie-down roping.

MARK OUT: in the bare back and saddle bronc riding, a cowboy's feet must be above the point of the horse's shoulders when the horse makes its first move out of the chute – if so he marked the horse out, but if not, he missed him out and the ride is disqualified.

PICKUP MEN: the two mounted cowboys who help riders dismount, release the bucking horse's soft flank strap, and escort the bucking horses and bulls to the exit gate after a ride.

PIGGIN STRING: in tie-down roping, the small rope used to tie a calf's legs together.

RANK: an adjective of the praise and respect used to describe especially challenging roughstock

RE-RIDE: if a horse or bull doesn't buck to performance specifications, the judges may offer the cowboy a clean-slate chance, on a different horse or bull.

STANDINGS: a professional cowboy's success is measured in earnings and cowboys may keep track of where they rank in yearly earnings in several sets of standings

TRY: a noun used for both cowboys and livestock, denoting grit, determination, fitness, stamina and resilience. "Give that cowboy a hand – he had a lot of try."








making it a state icon and one of the top rodeo companies in the United States. Bud, a saddle bronc rider and pick up man, was highly respected as one of the best bucking horse men in the industry. He built a breeding program that today is one of the most sought after horse herds in the world

Today the Bar T Rodeo Company has been passed to the third generation and is owned by Jeff and Wendie

Flitton, along with their son a fourth generation family member Cody Flitton. The Bar T could not run and operate without the help of many family members, Evelyn Kerby, Sam and Kellie Addington, Lori and Martin Pierce who all love the family heritage and the sport of rodeo. The Bar T Rodeo family works hard maintaining the quality bucking horses and bucking bulls that the Bar T Rodeo has been known for.

In 2011 Bar T Rodeo's Fancy Pants won best saddle bronc of the Wrangler National Finals Rodeo as well as the 2012 Ram National Circuit Finals Rodeo horse of the year. Previous top stock awards have been awarded to bareback horse Alley Cat and saddlebronc horse Sparrow. Many years they have won top stock awards for the





Circuit Finals Rodeo. In 2011 Bar T Rodeo came home with four go round buckles from the Wrangler National Finals Rodeo. Bar T Rodeo has been awarded with the Remuda Award, for best bucking horse breeding program, two different times first in 2006 and again in 2011. In 2002 Bar T Rodeo helped produce the first Olympic Rodeo in Farmington, Utah.12 years ago Bud and Evelyn's daughter Wendie and her husband Jeff Flitton started a Bull breeding program. Several of the bulls they raised have been selected to go to the Wrangler National Finals Rodeo in Las Vegas, Nevada.








TYSON HUTCHISON
