APRIL 1- PUBLIC LANDS LAW ENFORCEMENT



BLM fields a force of approximately 200 Law Enforcement Rangers (uniformed officers) and 70 Special Agents (criminal investigators) who enforce a wide range of laws and regulations in the prevention, detection, and investigation of crimes affecting public lands resources. **Scott Lowrey**, a ranger based at the St. George Field Office, will discuss law enforcement challenges on public lands in the region.
