FEBRUARY 2- JUDY ZUMWALT, TRI-STATE ATV JAMBOREE

Do you want to experience fantastic OHV trails of Southwest Utah and Northwest Arizona? The 14th annual Tri-State ATV/UTV Jamboree has 28 rides planned, including 5 brand new rides. Each ride will be led by experienced guides who not only know the trails but also the history of the area and key points of interest.

FEBRUARY 9 – DIXIE LIFE FLIGHT

It can be overwhelming when you are caring for an injured or sick loved one, especially when you need to transport them to another medical facility. Intermountain Healthcare's Life Flight Services offers highly specialized medical transport using helicopters, airplanes, and ambulances. The service area for Life Flight helicopters generally encompasses a 200-mile circle centered on each base. Services include inter-facility transport, response to accident scenes, and search and rescue missions (including rescue hoist missions).

FEBRUARY 16 – SAND HOLLOW STATE PARK

With its warm, blue waters and red sandstone landscape, Utah's newest state park is also one of its most popular. Boat and fish on Sand Hollow Reservoir, explore and ride the dunes of Sand Mountain on an off-highway vehicle, then RV or tent camp in a campground or the beach. A favorite destination for local off-highway vehicle (OHV) enthusiasts, Sand Mountain provides 15,000 acres of perfectly sculpted dunes. The red sand is an incredible backdrop for Sand Hollow reservoir.

FEBRUARY 23 – DIANE AZEVEDO, DINOSAUR DISCOVERY SITE

See thousands of fossilized dinosaur footprints at the St. George Dinosaur Discovery Site at Johnson Farm. This rare site preserves a 200 million year old lake ecosystem that includes dinosaurs, fishes, plants, sedimentary structures, and other animals. Additionally, the museum houses accurate life-restorations of animals from the Early Jurassic such as *Dilophosaurus*, *Megapnosaurus*, *Scelidosaurus*, and *Protosuchus*.
