ABOUT THE PRESENTER: Dr. Leo Lyman was born in Delta, UT in 1942. In 1969, he moved to Riverside, CA and started teaching. In 1981, he received his Ph.D. from University of California, Riverside. After 40 years of teaching in CA, he moved to Silver Reef UT in 2004. He continues to be a very active historian here in the Southwest. He was once Utah State Director of the Old Spanish Trail Association (OSTA) Dr. Lyman continues to research and write books, he has written over a dozen including: Political Deliverance:” The Mormon Quest for Statehood” published by the University of Illinois Press, 1986, “The Arduous Road: Salt Lake to Los Angeles, the Most Difficult Wagon road in American History” privately printed in Victorville, 2001, and many others.
