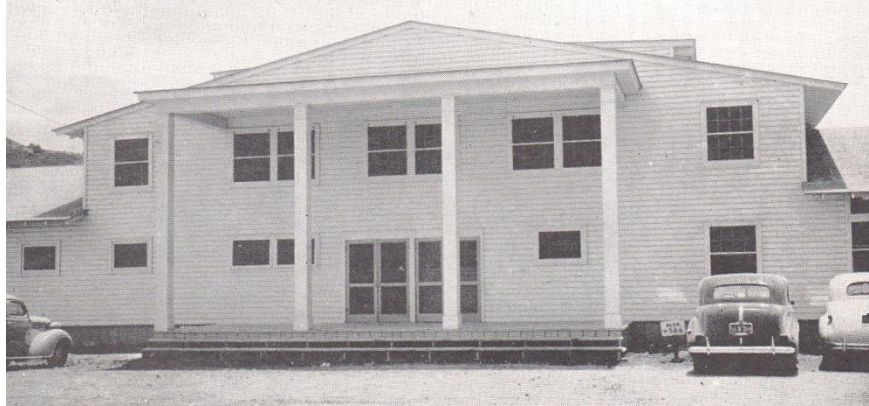

Lineage and Honors

HEADQUARTERS AND HEADQUARTERS COMPANY
115th ENGINEER GROUP

Parent unit constituted in 1920 in the Utah National Guard as the 115th **Engineer Regiment** (Combat), an element of the 40th Division (later redesignated as the 40th Infantry Division)

(2d Battalion withdrawn 3 November 1928 and allotted to the State of Nevada- hereafter separate lineage)

1st Battalion organized and Federally recognized 17 July 1939 with **Headquarters at Salt Lake City**
[May 2, 1939 Pappy joins the Utah National Guard. He is 17 yrs old.]

Reorganized and redesignated 5 February **1942** as the **115th Engineer Battalion**

Redesignated 12 October **1943** as the 115th **Engineer Combat Battalion**

Inactivated 7 April 1946 at Camp Stoneman, California

Battalion relieved 25 June **1946** from assignment to the 40th Infantry Division; concurrently broken up and its elements expanded and redesignated as follows:

Headquarters as Headquarters and Headquarters Company, 115th
Engineer **Combat Group**

(Headquarters and Service Company and Medical Detachment as the 115th Engineer Combat Battalion; Company A as the 1457th Engineer Combat Battalion; Company B as the 1334th Engineer Combat Battalion; Company C converted, reorganized, and redesignated as Battery B, 213th Armored Field Artillery Battalion-hereafter separate lineages)

Reorganized and Federally recognized 22 October **1947** in the Utah Army National Guard at Salt Lake City as Headquarters and Headquarters Company, 115th Engineer Combat Group

Ordered into active military service 19 August **1950** at Fort Douglas

(Headquarters and Headquarters Company, 115th Engineer Combat Group [NGUS] organized and Federally recognized 2 September **1952** at Fort Douglas)

Reorganized and redesignated 1 April **1953** as Headquarters and Headquarters Company, 115th Engineer Group

Released from active Federal service 3 December **1954** and reverted to state control; Federal recognition concurrently withdrawn from Headquarters and Headquarters Company, 115th Engineer Group (NGUS)

Location of Headquarters changed 1 February **1955** to Murray; in **1959** to Salt Lake City; on 30 July 1962 to Murray

Location changed 1 January 1989 to Draper

Ordered into active Federal service 18 December 2003 at Draper; released from active Federal service 14 June 2005 and reverted to state control
