March 11, 1873

Monday. This morning, by Bro. Jackson's request, I went with him, Jackson, to visit Bros Ash Nebeker & D Bagly. Met Bro Ash Nebeker & we three went to the Tything Office where Bro Nebeker requested Bro Slack to be an observing witness to what passed between him (Nebeker) & Jackson. Segregation was mentioned but learned that a bonafied deed of sale, not canceled, existed between Gass & Nebeker, in care of Slack, hence no safe segregation of the mine. Jackson & Nebeker both accused each other of incorrect statements in the High Council of St. George on last Saturday the 9th. Bro Bagly came in & Jackson accused him also of making faults statements in the council on the same occasion.

March 12, 1873

Tuesday. I trimmed some trees, planted beets & Japanese peas.

March 13, 1873

Wednesday. I watered my lucern & planted cucumbers.

June 8, 1877 – November 20, 1877

June 8, 1877

Friday. Working about home. Strong wind so I could not haul my jay.

June 9, 1877

Saturday. I hauled hay. A number of the people went to the Reef to witness a horse race there.

June 10, 1877

Sunday. We attended meeting.

June 11, 1877

Monday. Evening we killed 2 sheep.

June 12, 1877

Tuesday. I took the water at 12 o'clock last night and kept it until (*unreadable*).

June 13, 1877

Wednesday. I went to the Reef and seen (*unreadable*) about taking these poor bulls. He said to drive them above town and let them go.

June 14, 1877

Thursday. I drove those beeves above town (*rest unreadable*).

June 15, 1877

Friday. At home not well. My (*missing text*) are sore. Evening killed (?) sheep.

June 16, 1877

Saturday. (*unreadable*) and I went to Babalon.

June 17, 1877

Sunday. At home not well, wrote a letter to Burton Kimball concerning the payment of the \$18 note I hold against him.

June 18, 1877

Monday. I went down the river and got a small load of (?) wood.

June 19, 1877

Tuesday. I went to Babalone with mutton & vegetables to sell.

June 20, 1877

Wednesday. I finished cleaning ditch front of lot. Bought 10 beef cattle of J. Willis for \$4 per hundred. 3 o'clock took the water, evening I killed two sheep. Billy Foresythe helped me.

June 21, 1877

Thursday. I went to Babalone and sold vegetables & meat. Mr Gass, one of the proprietors of the (?) mill has gone to the city without making (*missing text*).

June 22, 1877

Friday. At home choring about. Evening killed two sheep alone.

June 23, 1877

Saturday. I went to Babalone to take supplies. Bro Forsythe had settled with McKinzy & crew & they left without finishing the job. Bro. Forsythe protested the order that James Kean gave Burton on Forsythe which I had excepted & paid supposing it to be right previous to my getting it. One of our workmen McKinzy said in substance that it was good and it would apply on their work, but now refuses it.

June 24, 1877

Sunday. Went to meeting with Adelaide, Mary Ann & children.

June 25, 1877

Monday. I put a partition fence through my corral that the beef cattle may be kept in one portion of it. Evening Foresythe & I killed one sheep.

June 26, 1877

Tuesday. I took meat & vegetables to Babalon to the people. I should stop coming except I got to pay the (?) boy herding for me. Foresythe killed one sheep while I was gone to Babalon.

June 27, 1877

Wednesday. I cut some of my luceran on my lot, had the water until 10 o'clock. Four of Branard's cows threw my field bars down and got into my field.

June 28, 1877

Thursday. I finished cutting my luceran on my lot & put some of it up in the barn.

June 29, 1877

Friday. I put up my hay & howed in the gardain. Bro Braner's cow got into my field. This is the third day in succession that they, four in number, have thrown my bars & fence down, walked in eat, done much damage to my crops. Last evening I sent my son & informed them of their trespassing stock & this evening I went myself. Bro. Braner sent his son Henry for them & said they should be cared for.

June 30, 1877

Saturday. At home commenced to haul hay.

July 1, 1877

Sunday. I finished haling my hay. Rote a letter & regeristed it. Hunter & Co. with \$5.25 in it to buy several articles advertised in the banner.

July 2, 1877

Monday. I & Riley Foresythe drove the beef cattle that I bout of John Willis.

July 3, 1877

Tuesday. We drove them on to the mountain & Riley come home.

July 4, 1877

Wednesday. I got 25 fat sheep and come home.

July 5, 1877

Thursday. I worked in the garden. I got Elisha Groves Lee to heard my fat sheep.

July 6, 1877

Friday. I went down the river & got a load of wood.

July 7, 1877

Saturday. I got two cows from Bellview.

July 8, 1877

Sunday. I used the water. Yesterday Elisha found a sheep while herding.

Last night Clarry Ann was very sick. She is rather better today.

July 9, 1877

Monday. I dug potatoes & worked in the gardain, formed a box into a cupboard for the cellar, got letter from Levi M.

July 10, 1877

Tuesday. Working about home. The weather is very warm. I am not able to work much this hot weather.

July 11, 1877

Wednesday. Working about home, the weather is warm yet.

July 12, 1877

Thursday. I took about 20 lbs. strained honey from my bees & by dividing then made one stand more.

July 13, 1877

Friday. I plowed where my potatoes grew.

July 14, 1877

Saturday. I went to Kanarah to attend a business meeting for our sheep heard, but the meeting had been adjourned before I arrived caused by the cleark not having the accounts ready. Paid J.N. Berry \$14.00 on the amount due for the sheep that I had got then returned & arrived home at 9 o'clock evening, called at Bellview & got a glass of wine of Sister Silvester.

July 15, 1877

Sunday. I used the water.

July 16, 1877

Monday. Bro. Foresythe & I went to Babalon to try to collect money due from Mires, Wolley & Gass. Mires & Wooley were not at home. Gass said he would have green backs enough within a week to pay all. His mill, a fine piece of machinery commenced crushing ore this morning in (?).

July 17, 1877

Tuesday. At home, planted some corn. Evening Foresythe, J Clawson & George (?) went to Babalon. Wether very warm.

July 18, 1877

Wednesday. At home, let Foresythe have my roan mare for Jo Clawson to put into their team to bring Woolsey goods from Babalon preparatory to taking them to Pioche. Woolsey was owing Foresythe & me \$7.85 which he said he could not pay until he got to Pioche where he thought he could borrow it of his step father. Foresythy refused to assist in attaching Woolsey's goods. I said we would attach, but Mr. Woolsey concluded & did pay rather than to have his goods attached.

July 19, 1877

Thursday. A. Spilsbury cut my luceran in the forenoon. At 2 o'clock I took the water.

July 20, 1877

Friday. I put up the moste of the hay that A Spilsbury cut yesterday. I mowed some along the ditch.

July 21, 1877

Saturday. I finished putting up my hay & would have hauled some but a shower of rain prevented.

July 22, 1877

Sunday. I hauled my hay, yet I am very unwell.

July 23, 1877

Monday. I am not well. I set some posts to make a shed over the stove, evening I killed two sheep – mutton.

July 24, 1877

Tuesday. I & family attended celebration at the Hall, a good many gentiles present. Bro Birch & I were all that made & public speech & that by request of community. Horse racing in town on the lower street in the afternoon, rained a little in the night.

July 25, 1877

Wednesday. Dug a few onions.

July 26, 1877

Thursday. Had the water.

July 27, 1877

Friday. I am not well. Sheep got away from the boys & I found them on the sandy 3 miles away, one sheep missing. Evening killed one.

July 28, 1877

Saturday. Afternoon I went to Babalone to inquire after money due Foresythe & me. Goddard & Leonard Milling their oar; Gass promise to pay soon. Buell is at (?) Ranch sobering of; Myres at Reef keeping boarding house. Evening killed a sheep that Dodge's dog bit this morning.

July 29, 1877

Sunday. I wrote a letter to Levi M, also sent a card to Hunter & Co. acknowledging the receipt of goods he sent me & returned Bro. Miles letter with a few lines on the back saying I wood keep the fiber that Bro (?) had put up (2 bunches) for him here as soon as the money come to pay expenses.

July 30, 1877

Monday. I am very unwell being affected in my kidneys. I moved some of the luceran in my lot.

July 31, 1877

Tuesday. I am very unwell with severe pain in my loins & kidneys. I finished cutting my lucren on my lot.

Aug 1, 1877

Wednesday. I am very unwell with a weakness and pain in & about the kidneys, the right one appears the moste affected. At 12 o'clock noon took the water.

Aug 2, 1877

Thursday. I went to collect pay of Goddard & Leonard. Did not see them. Learned at Gass Mill where their oar had been crushed that Clark at Leeds had garnashead the bullion for debt.

Aug 3, 1877

Friday. I partially repaired the manger in my stable.

Aug 4, 1877

Saturday. I dug a portion of my onions. Bro Foresythe had my horse to go & get our pay of Goddard & Leonard – did not get it. Flood & another man, partners with Goddard & Leonard in the mine, managed the milling of the oar, got the money & left Goddard & Leonard to pay their debts with no money to pay with.

Aug 5, 1877

Sunday. At home, at 2 o'clock went to meeting with MaryAnn, Adelaide & the children.

Aug 6, 1877

Monday. I attended election. I & some others voted against G. Spilsbury, Martin Slack & I Duffin. Evening H Siler & wife called & stayed over night.

Aug 7, 1877

Tuesday. Took the water at 1 o'clock last night. Bro Siler helped me haul my hay with his team. I examined my middle beehive & found making queen sels.

Aug 8, 1877

Wednesday. I went & found Goddard at his mine & Leonard at the Reef. Neither have any money to pay their debts & very little property. This morning Bro Siler left for the Beaver Dam Mountain.

Aug 9, 1899

Thursday. I went again to the Steel & Lamb mine where I found Goddard. He agreed in writing to let Foresythe & me have all the oar now on the dump & all he got out to handle & mill until we got our pay. I took a sample of Goddard's tailings from the ruster to the Reef to get assayed. They promise to send the result tomorrow.

Aug 10, 1877

Friday. At home, planted a few cucumbers. Evening attended school meeting at the Hall. Some 20 attended. Charles Stapley & Isaac Duffin was re elected school trustees. They also voted (blank) percent school tax to be assessed & collected. Got the result of the Goddard tailing assay – fetched by Manard; it goes \$67.54.

Aug 11, 1877

Saturday. Planted a few cucumbers. Evening killed a sheep.

Aug 12, 1877

Sunday. At home. At 2 o'clock P.M. self & family attended meeting.

Aug 13, 1877

Monday. Last evening at 5 o'clock I took the water & kept it un 12 o'clock today. Bro. Siler & wife returned from the Beever Dams this evening. Stopped at Bro. Foresythe's over night

Aug 14, 1877

Tuesday. I went to the Steel & Lamb mine. Goddard & McCelvey are working. I promised to take them a quarter of mutton & a bottle of vinegar tomorrow. Evening killed a sheep.

Aug 15, 1877

Wednesday. I took the mutton & vinegar to Goddards & McCelvey. Returned & dug the remaining onions. Sisters Jackson & Cox spent the afternoon here.

Aug 16, 1877

Thursday. At home most of the day, talked with Bros Allen, A E Dodge & Jackson about making a move to obtain the auditing of the Toquerville School Trustees. Afternoon, Bishop Wm Bringhurst gave me a writing which stated, in substance, that I would be tried for my fellowship unless I complied (without delay) with the decision between Savage vs Nebeker, where in Judge Nebeker awarded a piece of my land & improvements to AE Dodge in 1872. The writing mentioned above has neither locality, date nor signature.

Aug 17, 1877

Friday. I got Bro Jackson's mule to work with my mare & got a load of wood. This being William Brummell's eighth birth day, in accordance to instruction of the Priesthood, we repared to the water above town where in presence of his mother, Aunt Adelaide & Sister Harmon, I baptized him into the Church of Jesus Christ of Latter-day Saints. He is my first childe by my wife Mary Ann C. He was confirmed into the Church in the Sunday School on Sunday morning August 19th, 1877 under the hands of Bishop Wm A Bringhurst (Tokerville) & Bishop Smith of Rockville, Bishop Bringhurst being mouth.

Aug 18, 1877

Saturday. I went to the Reef, bot 2 doz fruit cans and got \$30 dollars off Myres on what he owes Foresythe & me.

Aug 19, 1877

Sunday. I attended Sunday School, was present when Wm B was confirmed. Took the water at 10 o'clock A.M. & at 2 o'clock I & family attended ward meeting.

Aug 20, 1877

Monday. At home auditing business accounts. Foresythe had my mare to haul (?) to DuPay's mill.

Aug 21, 1877

Tuesday. At home most of the day. At 2 o'clock attended a legal trial before Judge Spicer (gentile) at the Tything Office; young Gardner vs Burton. Complaint: Burtons robbing Gardner of a money check of \$30 or more.

Aug 22, 1877

Wednesday. About home, cancel accounts & copying a writing for the High Council on the Dodge vs Savage Land question.

Aug 23, 1877

Thursday. I went to the Reef to see John Pendray, found him & got him to sign a note of \$46.17 which he owed Foresythe & Savage.

Aug 24, 1877

Friday. I rode to Leads & arranged for Bro William Sterling to watch the moves of Mr. Pendray & let me know if he was about to leave.

Aug 25, 1877

Saturday. At home posting some accounts. At 3 o'clock P.M. took the water. Evening I killed a sheep.

Aug 26, 1877

Sunday. Bro and Sister Angel returning home from Virgin City called & took dinner. Bro Clawson also took dinner with us. 2 o'clock P.M. I went to meeting alone. M Slack read a circular from the First Presidency after which Bro Nale made some excellent remarks. Evening Bro Foresythe footed up his vegetable account with Adelaide.

Aug 27, 1877

Monday. At home, not well. Yesterday I commenced writing a letter to Richard Brummell in England (in answer to one just received from him). I finished & mailed it to day. After noon I ground my sythes & commenced cutting my luceran. The Dutch boy come to work this morning.

Aug 28, 1877

Tuesday. I finished cutting my luceran in the field. Afternoon examined my bees & found the middle hive strong, no brood in the comb, but apparently making honey. The other two strong; some brood & honey. I got a registered letter from Jos. Orton, Clerk of High Council in St. George authenticating the notice the Bishop gave me on the 16th inst. Bro Miron Roundy, 2 boys & 4 horses returned from their orchard up the river & stoped over night.

Aug 29, 1877

Wednesday. Forenoon I put up the hay that I cut yesterday. Telegrams say the Pres. Brigham Young is dangerously sick with infermed in the bowels. Bishop W.A. Bringham called & said that at 12 o'clock noon to say the Pres B. Young was no better. Afternoon I went to Leads & see Bro Wm Stirling about J. Pendray's moves, learned that he was still at the Reef. News by Telegraph that Pres. B. Young died at 4 o'clock this afternoon. I got home at dark & found the news of Pres B Young's death confirmed here, all appear sad.

Aug 30, 1877

Thursday. At home, used the water, took it at 6 o'clock in the morning.

Aug 31, 1877

Friday. I hauled my hay out of the field. Had jack Allen's horse to haul with.

Sep 1, 1877

Saturday. At home, covered my hay temporally with slab, the former roof of the barn. Bro Goddard called to see about the ore that Foresythe was milling for him to get our pay of him. Evening killed a sheep.

Sep 2, 1877

Sunday. Myself & family attended President Young's funeral meeting at 12 o'clock at the Hall. By request of the bishop some 10 of the brethren made appropriate remarks, Levi Savage being one of the number that spoke.

Sep 3, 1877

Monday. I picked Razin grapes. Jacob (Welchman) caied them. Willie hearded sheep. I got a letter from Levi M at sunset, the Arazonia dated Aug 19th, he intends to start for Utah about the first of Sept, also got two Gardner's Monthly & a small packet of buckwheat from AL Siler.

Sep 4, 1877

Tuesday. At home making out some accounts. Afternoon I went to the Reef to get an essay on the tailings that DuPay had run through getting a small yeald of silver.

Sep 5, 1877

Wednesday. At home. Afternoon repaired the boys shoes.

Sep 6, 1877

Thursday. I started to St. George to attend the High Council on the coming Saturday pertaining to a piece of law that has been a long time in dispute between AE Dodge & myself. I rode to Washington and stoped over night with James Pace. Several of his family are afflicted with the chills.

Sep 7, 1877

Friday. I rode to St George, took dinner at Bro Hall's, I tolde him my business; he & I went to Bro Smith's. On our way there met Pres McCalister

who upon asking him, granted me an interview with him at 3 o'clock p.m. At Bro Smith's we had quite a laugh over the informal notice I got requiring me to settle satisfactorily with Bro AE Dodge or the High Council would try me for fellowship on Saturday the 8th of Sept., the instrument being without date, place or signature. Bro Smith & I met Pres McCalister agreeable to appointment & found him very determined. With difficulty I got the privilege to meet the High Council & show cause why I have not met with the decision of the council.

Sep 8, 1877

Saturday. I met in Council which decided that I should deliver both land & improvements to Bro AE Dodge. The land nor improvements is not, nor never was Bro AE Dodge's but I have to comply to save my fellowship. I rode to Washington & stoped over night with Bro James Pace.

Sep 9, 1877

Sunday. I rode home.

Sep 10, 1877

Monday. I went to the Reef & got \$9 from Mires, the amount due from him to Foresythe & me for supplies.

Sep 11, 1877

Tuesday. I got some of my lucern in my lot, bot 100 lbs flour of Jackson for \$5. Killed a sheep.

Sep 12, 1877

Wednesday. I had the water. Levi M arrived from Arazona having been gone nearly one year; he is going to Coalville to get his wife to take her to Arazonia. Receive a note from John Halpin requesting me to send him a bushel of peaches.

Sep 13, 1877

Thursday. At home, engaged the peches for Halpin of Francy Nail.

Sep 14, 1877

Friday. Adelaide & I went to the Reef with Levi M's team, took Halpines peaches & bot off the Jew Schwartz a suit of close for \$15 golde, also bot Adelaide & Mary Ann a pare of good shoes each for \$5 & Claray Ann a pare at Sultons for \$1.50.

Sep 15, 1877

Saturday. I hauled my hay & got a load of wood with Levi's team.

Sep 16, 1877

Sunday. At home moste of the day. Levi M & I went to meeting.

Sep 17, 1877

Monday. Bro Forsythe, myself and Mr. Rich from Gass' Mill went prospecting for mineral in the vicinity of Antelope Springs on the strength of young Jarves' statement to Foresythe.

Sep 19, 1877

Wednesday. We returned from our mineral search without success.

Sep 20, 1877

Thursday. I arranged with Bro Hill to make my wine at his place using this press & grinder. I prepared one of his wash tubs to use. Bro Foresythe had my mare to take butter to Babalon. Evening killed a sheep, got Harmon to repare wagon tung.

Sep 21, 1877

Friday. I repared & put to soke some tubs of Bro Hills preparatory for making wine.

Sep 22, 1877

Saturday. Self & family attended Bros Gates, Andrews & Ensign were the ministers & they gave excellent instructions.

Sep 24, 1877

Monday. We commenced picking grapes preparatory to making wine. I am making my wine at Bro Hills for 2 gallons on the hundred. I was very unwell but repared my wagon after which had to lay down awhile.

Sep 25, 1877

Tuesday. Continued preparations for wine making.

Sep 26, 1877

Wednesday. I ground my grapes. The missionaries returned from up the river & held meeting in the evening. I killed a sheep & then attended the meeting. A good spirit prevailed.

Sep 27, 1877

Thursday. I censed my wine barrels & tinned the hoop on the them.

Sep 28, 1877

Friday. Evening, I commenced to press my wine, continued all night & finished at 10 o'clock next morning.

Sep 29, 1877

Saturday. Hauled my wine home & put it in the cellar; also hauled my pounns (?) home.

Sep 30, 1877

Sunday. I wrote a letter to George Petty of Pettyville, Sanpeat concerning JC Snow's indebtedness to me; a card to GQ Cannon concerning what I owe on the Juvenile & one to GW Lawrence, Fayettvill, Neb, asking for his catalogue & price list wishing to obtain the Jeupprnong (?) Grape.

Oct 1, 1877

Monday. I repaired some barrels & put water on the pumnrys (?) to make vinegar. Evening I killed the last sheep belonging to Foresythe, Savage & Co.

Oct 2, 1877

Tuesday. I took 15 lbs. mutton to DuPay. He payed me \$5 in part payment of what he owes for mutton. He gave me \$32.50 to give to Bro Foresythe the which I done.

Oct 3,4,5, 1877

Wednesday, Thursday, Friday. Making wine.

Oct 6, 1877

Saturday. Bro Nielson, wife, dauter & law & sister Nixson from Washington come & stayed over.

Oct 7, 1877

Sunday. We had a good visit. They left for home A.M.

Oct 8, 1877

Monday. I cleaned out the ditch in front of my lot. P.M. I solde & delivered to AE Dodge, 532 lbs lyme at two & half cts per pound amounting t \$7.89.

Oct 9, 1877

Tuesday. At home, wrote an article of an agreement between A. Nebeker & me concerning the examining the Allen cow for a brand. Early in the morning, Bro Clawson sent for me before I was up to administer to him. He was very sick. John Batty went with me.

Oct 10, 1877

Wednesday. I got Charley Clawson to drive up my young mare & horse. I repaired my wagon brake. Charley come with my horses after dark. At 2 o'clock P.M. I attended appointed by the school trustees meeting to remit taxes.

Oct 11, 1877

Thursday. I repaired my harness, also caught & gentled my young mare a little.

Oct 12, 1877

Friday. Prepared for going north to Cedar City to dispose of my wool.

Oct 13, 1877

Saturday. Strong indications of storm. At 10 o'clock A.M., I & wife started for Cedar City, got to Kanarah at 8:30 P.M.

Oct 14, 1877

Sunday. Colde with mist of rain. We did not travel.

Oct 15, 1877

Monday. Morning, I got my wool & went to Cedar. The weather is cloudy & colde. Solde our wool for 29 ½cts per lb at coop store. Done same traveling. Stayed with Bro Nielson's.

Oct 16, 1877

Tuesday. We finished traiding & returned to Kanarah.

Oct 17, 1877

Wednesday. We returned home.

Oct 19, 1877

Friday. I harnessed my young mare to the wagon & drove around town.

Oct 20, 1877

Saturday. I went to Leads with horses & wagon to gentle my mare & to see Charlie Westover about hearing beef stock & mutton together. He declined. My son Willie was with me, we returned got a little wood.

Oct 21, 1877

Sunday. We attended meeting.

Oct 22, 1877

Monday. I went to Ransom's Molasses Mill & arranged for getting the 20 gallons I bargained for of Wm Ransom.

Oct 23, 1877

Tuesday. At home. Afternoon pressed out my vinegar on Tome Stapelys press,

Oct 24, 1877

Wednesday. Prepared my barrel & barreled my vinegar. Done little towards covering my barn.

Oct 25, 1877

Thursday. I repared a barrel for putting molasses in & worked at my barn.

Oct 26, 1877

Friday. I repared a wine barrel to put molasses in & worked at my barn.

Oct 27, 1877

Saturday. I took my barrels to the molasses mill to get the molasses that I am to have of Wm Ransom.

Oct 28, 1877

Sunday. At home. Sarah Ann Spilsbury, Rone Spilsbury's wife & young Wilkey's wife, she that was Levy Stocks spent the moste of the day with us.

Oct 29, 1877

Monday. At home canceling accounts of Foresythe, Savage & John Batty. The wind blew cold & strong from the North. I solde Fred Mullins a spotted cow for 40 gallons of molasses to e paid by M Willis.

Oct 30, 1877

Tuesday. This morning at day light, the ground was covered with snow & still snowing, but soon turned to rain & continued the most of the day. I remained at home.

Oct 31, 1877

Wednesday. At home cleaning up the chips from the wood pile. Ash Nebeker refused to sign the article of agreement concerning the brand on the OM Allen cow.

Nov 1, 1877

Thursday. Will, son Riley & I went to Leads, bought wife a pair of shoes at \$2.50 & 8 horseshoes at Birches. Bro John S Higby died today at 3 o'clock this P.M.

Nov 2, 1877

Friday. I got a load of wood. Wether is fine.

Nov 3, 1877

Saturday. The family attended Bro. Higbys funeral.

Nov 4, 1877

Sunday. At home. Bro Hammond & family took dinner with us.

Nov 5, 1877

Monday. I went to the molasses mill & got 6 gallons of molasses syrup.

Nov 6, 1877

Tuesday. I got a lode of wood.

Nov 7, 1877

Thursday. I went to Kanara & took 40 gallons of molasses. Left them at J Berry's, bought 30 bushels of potatoes of Pat Willis for \$1.00 a bushel. Took 15 bushels of them and come home on Saturday.

Nov 9, 1877

Saturday. Come home, broke my wagon tire on the one mile north of Toquer.

Nov 10, 1877

Sunday. I brought my wagon in.

Nov 12, 1877

Tuesday. At home.

Nov 13, 1877

Saturday. Winde harde from the north. At home canceling accounts.
Flanigain left this morning.

Nov 18, 1877

Sunday. Adelaide & I attended meeting. Brothers McCalister, Snow & G
Cannon from St. George were present & gave good instructions.

Nov 19, 1877

Monday. I went to the Reef & solde 10 half gallons of molasses at \$1.00.

Nov 20, 1877

Tuesday. Wind high from the north. Bro Reede called on his way to the
Reef. My sheep from the Kanara heard went back.
