

RICHARD BENTLEY DIES.

Was Former Mayor and Prominent
Man of St. George.

St. George, March 24.—Richard Bentley, former mayor and a merchant of St. George for many years, died of old age at his home early this morning. He was born in England 86 years ago.

Mr. Bentley was a pioneer mer-

chant of St. George, where he had lived since the 60s. He came to America in 1843, lived at Nauvoo for a few years and came to Utah in 1850. He went to California for a few years, but returned to Utah in 1861, living for a short time at Nephi and then moving to St. George which had been his home since that time.

He leaves a widow, six children, 40 grandchildren and 10 great-grandchildren. The sons are William O. Bentley and Frank R. Bentley of St. George, and Joseph C. Bentley of Mexico. The daughters are Mrs. E. G. Woolley of Salt Lake, Mrs. E. D. Woolley of Kanab, and Mrs. Nelson Terry of Enterprise.
