

RECORDS FOUND

As Brigham Young traveled from Salt Lake City down to areas South, to see to and visiting the developing areas, he did not have a lonely trip. On record we have him traveling with 98 persons, 34 wagons with 84 horses. President Brigham Young is recorded as preaching to the travelers on the necessity of building a fort. On such a trip the corners of Fort Harmony was marked. Noted in journals is the welcoming of Brigham and his groups at Harmony by preparing great feasts.

Farming and gardens were established as mission callings were given to the people to tend to this task. A lot was assigned in 10 acres plots for farms and one acre plots for gardens.
