Car tour of Spanish Trail sites starts at 2 p.m. from Main Street Park Lions Pavilion. Those who want to skip the car tour and just participate in the dinner and rides are welcome to come at 5 p.m. to Iron Springs.

The Spanish Trail was a 1,200 mile trade route that began in Santa Fe and connected New Mexico to five other states. Along the way, it ran through Cedar Valley. The *Spanish Trail Suite* explores the different cultures found along the historic route and depicts the difficulties and successes that they faced along the way. Sunrise honors the Paiute Tribe and Celebration incorporates an original hymn and fiddle music to represent the pioneers. The music was commissioned by the Orchestra of Southern Utah with support from the National Endowment for the Arts and has achieved national recognition from the League of American Orchestras and the NEA.
