**NOV 4 – DESERT TORTOISE HABITAT CONSERVATION IN SW UTAH –  
ANN McLUCKIE, WILDLIFE BIOLOGIST**

When you step over one of the Red Cliffs Desert Reserve's distinctive "step-over" gates, you are entering a special place, a 62,000-acre scenic wildlife reserve set aside to protect the Mohave Desert Tortoise and other rare plants and animals. At the merging of three great ecosystems, the Reserve is biologically rich with a unique array of animals and plants. The conditions in the region are such that several endemic species, those which occur nowhere else in the world, occur here.

**NOV 25 – DINOSAUR DISCOVERY SITE – DIANNA AZEVEDO, DIRECTOR**

The St. George Dinosaur Discovery Site at Johnson Farm houses exceptionally well-preserved dinosaur tracks, fossil fish and plants, rare dinosaur remains, invertebrate traces and important sedimentary structures. This site is described by many paleontologists as "one of the ten best dinosaur track sites in the world" and is one of the most important discoveries in Early Jurassic paleontological history
