APRIL 7 – WASHINGTON COUNTY HISTORY – LEO LYMAN

Edward Leo Lyman is a local history expert. In 1981, he received a Ph.D. from the University of California, Riverside. He taught at California State University, Riverside and at the Victor Valley College (where he is Emeritus Professor of History). After 17 years in Victor Valley CA, he moved to Silver Reef UT in 2004. He continues to be a very active historian here in the southwest. In 2007, he took over as the Utah State Director of the Old Spanish Trail Association (OSTA). Dr. Lyman continues to research, write, and is a popular lecturer.

APRIL 14 – SITE STEWARD & PETROGLYPH PATROL PROGRAMS – SUSAN CROOK, SUNCLF

Southwest Utah National Conservation Lands Friends (SUNCLF) is a local service group sponsored by Conserve Southwest Utah. Site Stewards help protect irreplaceable cultural and natural resources on BLM-managed public lands in Washington County. Site Steward teams help protect these resources by visiting their sites once a quarter and taking repeat photos that they submit with their written reports and time sheets. The Petroglyph Patrol is a "lite" version of the Site Steward program with a focus on protecting rock art - and less paperwork.

APRIL 21 – A STORY TO TELL – LANE RONNOW

"A Story to Tell" allows people to tell the story of their lives and have it recorded for posterity, as well as televised on the local cable channel. It is a thirty minute television interview program available also on the internet. A recent interview was with Freda Kelly who was the secretary for the "Beatles" for the ten years they were together. The interviews are not limited to celebrities but include all of us. The community TV channel will be recording this presentation.

APRIL 28 – FAVORITE PLACES ON THE ARIZONA STRIP – GREG WOODALL

An experienced archeologist and ethno-botanist, Greg has over 20 years of river and hiking guiding experience in fragile desert areas of the Colorado Plateau and "specializes" in the Arizona Strip. He will be describing some of his favorite places around that vast area.
