The next DASIA field trip is on Thursday, November 30 (subject to weather). It will be to the Jump Up Canyon on the Arizona Strip. Since the 1900s, Jump Up Cabin has been used by ranchers as well as the Forest Service, and is listed on the National Register of Historic Places. With a panoramic view of Kanab Creek Wilderness, the cabin sits on the edge of Jumpup canyon. From the front door you take in a wide open expanse of red rock descending into canyon walls below, lined with juniper, pinyon, yuccas, sage and Cliffrose. This trip will require 4WD high clearance vehicles. You can get information and/or make reservations at the Public Lands Information Center or call (435) 688-3200.
