## APRIL 6 – ARIZONA STRIP HELITAK – CORY JOHNSON

The Bureau of Land Management (BLM) is responsible for fire management on 12.2 million acres of public lands across Arizona. The agency's professional fire management staff provides wildland firefighting for protection of natural resources, as well as using fire as a to improve the health of the land. Helitack refers to "helicopter-delivered fire resources", and is the system of managing and using helicopters and their crews to perform aerial firefighting and other firefighting duties, primarily initial attack on wildfires.

## APRIL 13 – SPRING DESERT WILDFLOWERS – LEE HUGHES

Each year, the unique combination of sun, wind, water, temperature and elevation sets the stage for the precise location of the best springtime blooms. Lee Hughes is a retired rangeland management specialist who monitored rare and endangered plants in the region for decades. He will discuss what conditions are necessary for stunning desert blooms.

# **APRIL 20 – NATIONAL MONUMENTS IN UTAH – STEVE HEATH**

Recent events in Utah have brought a new focus on the Antiquities Act and the creation of national monuments. Steve Heath is a retired SUU professor who has researched the history of national monuments in Utah and the west. He will review the complicated processes that have resulted in present public lands management challenges.

Utah Archaeology and Historic Preservation Month celebrates Utah's rich archaeological and historical resources with a month of lectures and hands-on learning. Lori Hunsaker, a BLM archeologist, will review local events and discuss local preservation opportunities and challenges.
