Subject: Report on the DASIA field trip to the Kanab Point area 6/28/2018

The Dixie Arizona Interpretive Association (DASIA) held a field trip to Kanab Point on June 28, 2018. A great expanse of canyon falls away below your feet from this perch overlooking the confluence of the Kanab and Grand Canyons. Few people know about this lonely spot, yet it's one of the best Grand Canyon viewpoints.

This trip lasted from 8:30 am to 6:30 pm. We took Utah Highway 59 which joined Arizona Highway 389 out to the service station & minimart at Pipe Spring. We grouped up there and then caravanned on to Antelope Valley Rd = Mohave County Road 109 = Mt. Trumbull Road where we stopped until we had all 13 cars.

From there we headed southsouthwest on County Road 109 for about 25-30 miles to where we split off to the left at GPS coordinates 36° 34' 13.21" North Latitude, 112° 52' 51.78" West Longitude.

The next DASIA field trip is on 8/23/2018 to Powell Point in the Dixie National Forest on the Arizona Strip. This will be an extra long trip, leaving at 8:30 am and not returning until around 6:00 pm. Powell Point on Table Cliff Plateau offers unique Wasatch Limestone Formation soils that provide habitat for rare plant species that are locally endemic to southern Utah. The ancient bristlecone pines at Powell Point have weathered in this unique cushion plant community surrounded by steep cliffs, open escarpments and spectacular views. The parking area at the end of the road will have great views and we plan to lunch in that area. If time allows and for those who are interested, we may take in the hike on a foot trail for about three fourths of a mile to the base of Powell Point.
