Dear Colleagues of Dixie State University,

Our next Colleagues meeting will be feature Dr. Karl N. Snow, Jr., former BYU Vice President and former member of the Utah State Senate. The meeting will be held on Monday, March 4, 2019 at 12:00 noon in Lecture Hall 156 of the Taylor Health Science Center, located at 1526 East Medical Center (south of Lowe's and east of River Road).

Dr. Snow will address the life of his grandfather, Edward Hunter Snow, who was the founder of many early business ventures and water projects in Washington County. For 24 years he served as the stake president of the St. George Stake. He was involved with the Bank of St. George, Dixie College and SUU, and later served as chairman of the Utah State Tax Commission.

Karl N. Snow, Jr. was born in St. George Utah, the sixth child of Karl Nelson and Wanda McGregor Snow. He was born three weeks after the untimely death of his father, who was then serving as Dean of Men and Director of Business at Dixie College. His father was also a Justice of the Peace and Bishop of the St. George East Ward. Karl was blessed and given the name of his father by his grandfather, Edward Hunter Snow.

Karl Snow received a bachelor's degree from Brigham Young University, a master's degree from the University of Minnesota, and a Ph.D. from the University of Southern California School of Public Administration. He was the founder and director of a two-year graduate program in Public Administration at BYU, before being named Assistant Vice President for BYU Development. On leave from BYU, he served as Utah's first State Legislative Analyst. Later he was elected to the Utah State Senate, and for 12 years served as the Chairman of the State Constitutional Revision Commission. From 1998 to 2001, Karl and Donna opened the International Affairs Office of the Church of Jesus Christ of Latter-day Saints in New York City. They later served as Church Hosts for the 2002 Winter Olympic Games in Salt Lake City, before being called to Southeast Africa as Humanitarian Directors for six southeast countries. They returned to Southeast Africa four times to assist the Church's support for World Health Measles Immunizations.

Karl's roots run deep in Utah's Dixie. Following Karl's retirement, he and his wife Donna were called to erect a monument to his great grandfather, Erastus Snow. The monument now stands at the north entrance to the St George Tabernacle, commemorating the founding of St. George and the hardy pioneers who settled here. His maternal grandfather established the first hospital in St. George in 1913. Karl and Donna are the parents of six children scattered from coast to coast. They have 22 grandchildren and a ninth great grandchild is expected soon. We hope you will join us on Monday, March 4th for Dr. Snow's presentation.
