## ZION NATIONAL PARK FOREVER PROJECT PRESENTS FREE LECTURE ON JOHN WESLEY POWELL IN ST. GEORGE

Zion National Park Forever Project presents "Seeing Things Whole: John Wesley Powell and an Understanding of the American West" by author Christa Sadler at the Electric Theatre in St. George, 68 E. Tabernacle, on Thursday, May 2, 2019 at 7:30 p.m. This lecture is free and open to the public.

"As Zion National Park celebrates its Centennial, and as we recognize the 150<sup>th</sup> anniversary of Powell's first expedition of the Colorado River, it's fitting we offer this important lecture in St. George," said Zion Forever Project Executive Director Lyman Hafen. As a rafting guide on the Colorado River in the Grand Canyon and elsewhere in the region, Christa Sadler has called the rivers of the Colorado River Basin home for more than three decades. She holds a Masters Degree in Earth sciences and paleontology from Northern Arizona University and a Bachelors Degree in physical anthropology from the University of California at Berkeley. Christa has been writing and teaching in the landscapes shaped by the Colorado River since 1988 and has published several books and articles about the region.
