OCT 4 – GLEN CANYON CONSERVANCY – MARTIN STAMAT

Glen Canyon Conservancy partners with public lands in northern Arizona and southern Utah to create learning opportunities, enhance visitor experience, and inspire stewardship. Founded in 1986 as Glen Canyon Natural History Association, GCC offers educational programming, products, and services to help visitors find a lasting connection with their public lands. The organization utilizes member support and retail proceeds at 10 locations throughout the region to generate funds that support educational, safety, outreach, and research programs.

The Kanab Field Office is located in Utah's Kane County, near the Utah-Arizona border, Lake Powell, and Arizona's Grand Canyon. East of Kanab are the Vermilion Cliffs that run north through open country. The Paria River cuts through the Vermilion Cliffs traveling through the Paria Canyon-Vermilion Cliffs Wilderness Area on the Utah-Arizona border. Backpackers who visit this area hike through narrow, twisting canyons of the Buckskin Gulch and Paria River. We may even hear about a feature called the Wave!

OCT 25 – ARAVADA SPRINGS – MARK RAWLINS

For generations, the Nay Ranch (formerly known as the Whitney Ranch), has hosted family reunions, Boy Scout and Girl Scout groups, community and church groups, and large groups of friends.
