

N.Y.A. Boys Start Work On Tiger Football Field

HURRICANE, Utah—Actual work on the Hurricane football field was begun during this last week by the N.Y.A. boys, who are to be primarily responsible for the entire project. The field to be planted in grass is a quarter mile track.
