

Clerical Work For Nine NYA Youths Set Up In U. S. Offices

Approval was received today from the National Youth administration allocating \$1,710 to employ nine NYA youths for clerical work for government agencies in Washington county for a period of 10 months.

Sponsoring agencies will be: The Washington County Department of Public Welfare, Washington County officials, St. George City, U. S. Farm Security office, U. S. Department of Agriculture, County Agent, and U. S. Forest service.

Eligible youth from 17 and 24 will be assigned to general office work such as typing, dictation, bookkeeping, filing, operation of PBX boards and operation of various business machines including adding machines, duplicators and so forth.

Major objective of the project is to give the youth practical work experience and to aid them in developing good work habits and personal traits desirable for private employment. Related training will be given by the public schools.

Youth will be paid part-time wages for production for these government agencies, R. Easton Moffitt, NYA area director of southern Utah stated.

Relief requirements for the youth or their families are not necessary for youth to become eligible for assignment to Mr. Moffitt.
