Janet McKay Morral were in attendtance 14 representives from Hurricane
Camp 2 from Enterprize were present. President Lund said that the Dau

Daughters should become such a part of the Community that they cannot be done without. We are not only makers of histories but writers of history. The Pioneer's of Utah are all that came before May 10, 1869. We are 32 years in advance of the son's. Cooperate with them.
