IT IS quite common knowledge today that worry and anxiety can and do cause ulcers. But it seems that only a few persons understand how to reverse the worry and cure the ulcer. Professional people who deal with these things in a secular way (or from a non-Bible standpoint) know the causes but not the cure.

For the cure is in reversing the worry and replacing it with confidence and joy. But you can't think confidence and joy just because you might wish to. You have to have a reason for your faith. That reason is a healthy knowledge of your own soul as the one reigning god of your body. Expel the other illusionary gods from your mind. In other words, since you know that thought-force creates (it creates ulcers), you know a most precious thing. You know the Creator. Since this force creates, can it not create the success of the situation about which you are worried? Then, put joy and confidence into your thinking—and no harm shall come to you.

Dartmouth Fund Gets \$25,000

HANOVER, N. H., March 18—A gift of \$25,000 by Mr. and Mrs. George F. Jewett of Spokane, Wash., toward the Hopkins War Memorial Program at Dartmouth College was announced today. George F. Jewett Jr., son of the donors, is a member of last year's class. The Fund, named for the President Emeritus, Ernest Martin Hopkins, is for a physics laboratory and, later, a large auditorium on the Dartmouth campus. The present total of the Hopkins Fund is \$1,790,000. Costs of the two buildings are estimated in excess of \$3,500,000.
