January 25, 1916 - April 30, 2012

LoRen "Loie" Watson Snow passed away on Monday, April 30, 2012, at home. She was 96 years old. She was born on January 25, 1916, in St. George, Utah to Daniel Clark Watson and Anna Hess Milne.

She is preceded in death by her parents; her husband, Virgil C. Snow, MD; three grandsons, Richard Russell, Quincy Madsen, and Scott Rice; her sister, Wetona "Toni" Edwards; and one brother, Leon Watson.
