


Everlaine “Ev” Haney

Everlaine “Ev” Haney [also known as Eveline, Everett, or E V] was born 28 April 1853 in Clay County, Indiana. He was the seventh of eleven children of Patrick Haney and Rebecca J Brackney. In 1860, the family was living in Perry Township, Clay, Indiana.¹ By 1870, they had moved to Jonathan’s Creek, Moultrie, Illinois, where Ev was a worker on the family farm.²

Ev married Malvina Arthursa Jolley on 22 January 1880 in Washington City, Washington, Utah Territory. They had seven children, all born in Washington City. On the 1880 census, Ev was a quartz mill worker, living with his wife in Silver Reef, Washington, Utah Territory.³ By 1903, he was in Prescott, Yavapai, Arizona Territory⁴, where he was registered to vote from 1906 through 1924.⁵ Ev and Malvina may have been divorced, as Ev married Mrs. Emma Kate Hull Hermann about 1907 in Arizona. Malvina died in 1930.

On the 1910 census, he was a gold miner, living with his wife Emma and a step-daughter in Prescott.⁶ Ev’s voter registration described him having dark hair and brown eyes, about five foot nine inches, and weighing about 160 pounds.⁷ In 1920, he was a mining engineer, living with his stepson in Prescott.⁸ Emma died in 1928⁹, and Ev was living with his daughter and son-in-law in San Francisco, San Francisco, California, in 1930.¹⁰ It is unknown when or where Ev died.
