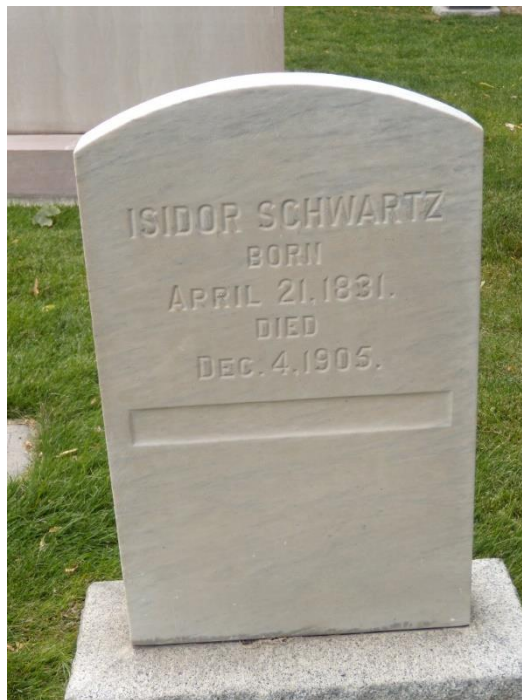


## Isadore Schwartz

Isadore Schwartz was born 30 May 1830 in Germany He was the son of Marcus Schwartz and Rebeckah Levich.<sup>1</sup> He and three of his brothers immigrated to America and participated in the gold rush in California. In 1860, Isadore was a clerk, living in Tuolumne, California.<sup>2</sup> He married Catherine about 1867 and they had two sons, one of whom died young. They lived in New York City, New York, in 1870.<sup>3</sup> Catherine died, and Samuel married Laura Berwin in 1871 in New York City, New York.<sup>4</sup> They had one son.

By 1880, Isadore was a miner, living with his wife and two sons in Silver Reef, Washington, Utah Territory.<sup>5</sup> On the 1900 census, he was living with his brother and his son in Park City, Summit, Utah. He was a partner to his brother in his retail and wholesale liquor business.<sup>6</sup> His wife had accused him of ill treatment in 1895. She filed for divorce on grounds of offensive language, "cruelty, habitual drunkenness and failure to support" and received it in 1902.<sup>7</sup>

Isadore died from a lingering illness due to a spinal accident on 4 December 1905 in Salt Lake City. He was buried in the B'Nai Israel Cemetery in Salt Lake City.<sup>8</sup> He was a pioneer miner at Silver Reef, Utah Territory, and at Wood River, Idaho.<sup>9</sup>
