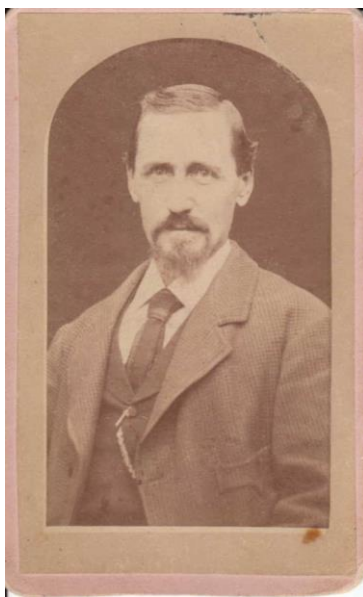


Julius D Hickox

Julius D Hickox was born about April 1830 in Ohio. He married Ella about 1857 in Connecticut. They had one son.¹ On the 1860 census, he was a tailor, living without his family, in Scott River Township, Siskiyou, California.² In 1870, he bid for the California mail route from Red Bluff to Yreka, 147 miles and back once a week, for the pay of \$7,200 per year.³ In 1870, he was a teamster, living with his wife and son in Hamilton, White Pine, Nevada.⁴ In 1875, he was a teamster living alone in a hotel in Lander, Nevada.⁵

By 1880, he was an express agent, living alone in Silver Reef, Washington, Utah Territory.⁶ He was also listed as being in "liquors".⁷ In 1884, he was appointed a US Commissioner for Washington County.⁸ Ella may have died, because Julius married a widow with six children, Mrs. Elizabeth Martha Waldon Akerill, on 26 August 1888 in Lake View, Utah, Utah Territory.⁹ On the 1900 census, he was a traveling clothing salesman, living with his second wife and four stepsons in Althouse, Josephine, Oregon.¹⁰ Julius died 8 October 1905 in Josephine, Oregon.¹¹ Elizabeth lived in Washington with her son in 1910¹² and died there in 1921.¹³
