

Susannah Walker Fuller Clark Green Johnson Millett

Susannah Walker "Susie" Fuller was born 21 December 1871 in Harrisburg, Washington, Utah Territory. She was the second of seven children of Elijah Knapp Fuller and Harriet Alice Walker. Her father had five older wives and a total of 33 children, of which Susie was the twenty-eighth. When she was born, her mother was age 27 and her father was 60. In 1880, the family of two wives, twelve children, and a grandson, was farming in Harrisburg.¹

Susie married James Edward Clark in 1890 in Silver Reef, Washington, Utah Territory.² She was 18 and he was 37, they had four children. They lived in Park City, Summit, Utah Territory, for a while and then moved to Mammoth, Juab, Utah. On the 1900 census, James was a silver miner, and they were living with his widowed mother and three children in Eureka, Juab, Utah.³ In 1904, they moved to Mercur, Tooele, Utah. James died from septicemia in the Holy Cross Hospital in Salt Lake City in 1906. He was buried in the Calvary Cemetery.⁴

Susie married Charles Johnson in 1907 in Salt Lake City.⁵ They lived in Mammoth where Charles was a gold and silver miner.⁶ They had one son who died of meningitis as an infant.⁷ Charles died in a mining accident in 1911 in Mammoth and was buried in the Salt Lake City Cemetery.⁸ Susie sued the Consolidated Mercur Gold Mining company for \$5,000 damages in the death of her husband. The claim was settled for \$1,055 to support her four Clark children.⁹

In 1920, Susie was living with her three sons in Benjamin, Utah, Utah.¹⁰ She lived with her son Edward in 1930 in Benjamin¹¹, then married Amasa Lyman Green in 1931 in Manti, Sanpete, Utah.¹² Amasa died of a cerebral hemorrhage in 1935 in Mona, Juab, Utah, and was buried in the city cemetery.¹³ Susie married Charles William Millet in 1939; they were living in Spring Lake in 1940.¹⁴ Charles died of a coronary occlusion in 1954 in Spring Lake, Utah¹⁵, and was buried in Marion, Summit, Utah. Susie died 7 November 1957 in Spanish Fork, Utah, Utah, and was buried in the city cemetery.

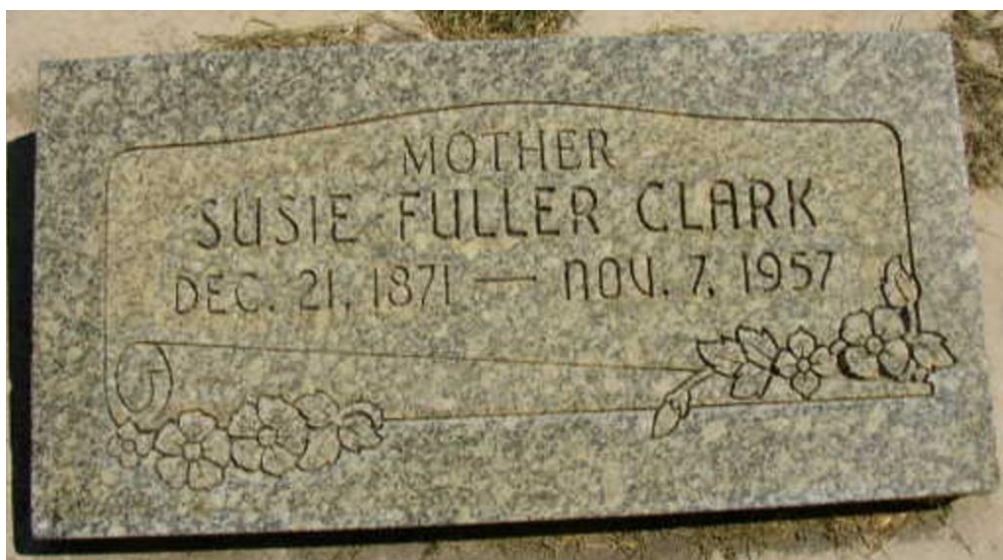
