

**WM. D. SULLIVAN 86,  
DIES AT LEEDS, OCT. 30.**

William Duncan Sullivan, 86, veteran stockman and farmer, died at his home in Leeds, Utah, Tuesday, Oct. 30, at 1:30 p.m. of ailments incident to age, after a brief illness.

Born June 4, 1859, at Santaquin, Utah, he was a son of Archibald and Julia A. Matthews Sullivan. When he was aged three the family moved to St. George, where he spent his boyhood years. As a young man he followed team work and freighting, hauling silver ore from Silver Reef mines to the Babylon Mill on the Virgin river.

While employed at Silver Reef he met Mary Ann McMullin whom he married Oct. 22, 1883. They spent their early married life at St. George and Harrisburg, moving to Leeds in 1892, where he has since resided. Mrs. Sullivan died May 7, 1936. Mr. Sullivan was well known as a stockman and farmer, and always drove excellent horses.

Surviving are 11 sons and daughters: William Duncan Sullivan Jr. and Mrs. Verda S. Woodbury, Hurricane; Frank and Cleo Sullivan, St. George; Leland G., Evan and Mrs. Lillian S. Stratton, Leeds; Mrs. Stella S. Kemp, Mrs. Rhea S. Storm and Dellas Sullivan, Salt Lake City; and Mrs. Ethel S. Bastian of Weston, Idaho; 48 grandchildren and 43 great-grandchildren, one brother, Charles Sullivan of Baker, Calif., and two sisters, Mrs. Julia Gray of Salt Lake City, and Mrs. Jessie McQuarrie of Compton, California.
